In Aizuwakamatsu, at the Painted Candle Festival, featuring candles painted individually with flowers by local artists, flickering flames combine with the stately Tsuruga-jo Castle to create another memorable nightscape.

The Ageha Inn- A Favorite of Warrior Kanmu Heishi with the Atmosphere of a Samurai Home

Ageha, a well-known inn on the banks of the river in the Yunishigawa Valley, is known for its beautiful wooden architecture and association with the samurai warrior Kanmu Heishi. In the dining room, which is inside an old farmhouse relocated to this spot, diners can enjoy the best of the seasonal foods available from local mountains and rivers. The inn also boasts the 'Kiwami', a special set of rooms previously used as a warrior's house, with traditional fittings and furnishing that communicate the history of both Yunishigawa as a hideaway and of Nikko as an ancient city. https://agehanoyado.jp/english/





Enjoy Japanese Cultural Entertainment at Ookawaso in the Ashinomaki Onsen Resort

Ashinomaki Onsen has served as a hot spring for around 1200 years. Ookawaso is a famed, long-standing inn with room for 110 guests, providing entertainments including traditional Japanese musical instrument (shamisen) performances and the chance to pound rice into rice cakes (only on specified dates). The inn's baths includes an outdoor terrace bath with a wonderful scenic view as well as another bath built out over the valley.
